Park for free and enjoy the city this summer




Free nighttime parking!

There's a reason why Kings Park features on so many postcards and Insta posts. This incredible natural attraction is one of the largest inner-city green spaces in the world, with stunning wildlife and panoramic views of the City skyline. Your family will love wondering through the Botanic Gardens and taking in the rich variety of native flora and fauna. If you like to learn while you stroll you can always join a volunteer-led guided tour and find out more about the Park's unique plant life and history.



Make sure to explore the Lotterywest Federation Walkway, a glass tree-top bridge that offers stunning views of the Park's canopy. You can also experience the Rio Tinto Naturescape, where nature play comes alive with rushing creeks, aerial walkways, and towering tree tops. And don't forget to pack a picnic to enjoy in one of the many picturesque spots!



Life's a picnic in the City's secret gardens

It's time to put down your phone, pick up a panini and enjoy a relaxing picnic at one of the City's picturesque parks or gardens. There's plenty of playgrounds, swings, and open spaces so the kids can play while you relax. With its tranquil lake, charming walking paths and lush gardens, Harold Boas Gardens in West Perth is the perfect destination for a family picnic. Queens Gardens in East Perth is also a top spot to consider—a serene space with beautiful lawns and shaded areas, ideal for unwinding while the kids explore nature.

The art of discovering the City

Take a tour de force of the senses, as you explore the City's vibrant street art through a guided art walking tour. The iCity Art Tour lets you discover public artworks hidden in laneways, streetscapes and even ceilings, showing how art has transformed the places we live, work, and play.

If you're an admirer of aboriginal, local and international street artists, you can also sign up for Oh Hey WA's walking tour – a leisurely 3km tour suitable for all ages. It's another great way to get to see your City's artistic side.



Let's point to Point Fraser

With water-front views, scenic paths and wide inviting spaces, you can't go past Point Fraser Recreation Precinct for a fantastic family day out. Birdwatchers will love the opportunity to spot some winged friends. Come prepared by checking out our Bird Spotting Guide on page 17!

You can also take in the scenery with a refreshing bike ride along Perth's stunning foreshore. About Bike Hire is located at Point Fraser and offers easy rentals, with their Perth Bridges Ride recommended as a family-friendly option. The flat 10km route follows the Swan River, taking you past the iconic Swan Bells and offering breathtaking City views. If you've got energy to burn, you can add an additional loop incorporating the Windan Bridge, which will take you past the East Perth Development and the beautiful Burswood Lakes, home to a variety of bird life.



Discover nature at Perth City Farm!

A hidden, natural treasure in the heart of the City, Perth City Farm provides a hands-on experience with nature and sustainability. Explore the community gardens, meet farm animals and learn about sustainable farming practices in this unique urban oasis.







The Nyoongar people have been following the Six Seasons for thousands of years. The seasons—Birak, Bunuru, Djeran, Makuru, Djilba, and Kambarang—aren't marked by specific dates, but by changes in the local environment. Aboriginal people recognise these seasonal shifts by observing signs like wind, rainfall and temperature, as well as plants, animals, and the stars.

How Nyoongar seasons came to be

Dreaming stories tell us the Waugal (Rainbow Serpent) taught the Nyoongar people about the seasons and how to care for the land. This wisdom has been passed down through generations by Nyoongar Elders.

What makes Kambarang and Birak special?

Kambarang Season spans October and November and is symbolised by the colour yellow to represent the return of the warmer weather. This season is marked by an explosion of colour as wildflowers bloom across our landscape.

Snakes and reptiles also start to wake from hibernation, using the sun's warmth to fuel their hunt for food.

Birak is the summer season from December to January, denoted by the colour red to represent intense heat, sun and fire. Luckily, the cool sea breeze, known as the 'Freo Doctor', helps ease the scorching heat on most afternoons.

Birak is also called the Season of the Young because it's a time of growth. Tadpoles turn into frogs, flowers produce seeds, snakes shed their skin and baby birds learn to fly.

Kambarang and Birak in the City of Perth

Kambarang, with its abundance of wildflowers, is the perfect time to observe wildlife around the City of Perth. You can follow the West Perth native bee scene trail, which features bee hotels and wildflower gardens.

Birak is the perfect time to find shade and water to cool off. In the City of Perth, you can relax by the Derbarl Yerrigan (Swan River) or seek shelter under the leafy trees in local parks. Boorloo (Perth) is situated on Whadjuk Nyoongar Boodja (Country). We acknowledge the Whadjuk Nyoongar people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands and waters where our City is situated today. There are many places across Boorloo that are of cultural and spiritual significance for the Whadjuk Nyoongar people.

Explore Aboriginal history and culture with your family

Perth is an incredible City to explore the culture of the Nyoongar people, the Traditional Owners of the land we live on, and we're spoilt for choice when it comes to educational and cultural attractions that tell us all about them. Check out the places and trails in the City of Perth where your family can explore Aboriginal culture and history.



Public art

Lots of Aboriginal art is displayed across the City, celebrating and acknowledging culture, storytelling and traditions. How many can you find?



WA Museum Boola Bardip

The WA Museum Boola Bardip hosts 'Spinifex People: Art and Stories from Pila Nguru' from 5 December to 4 May, showcasing the rich culture and storytelling of the Spinifex People.



Self-guided tours

The City of Perth boasts a fantastic range of walking trails, including two self-guided 'Karla Yarning' (Home-Fire Yarning) tours, each taking approximately 1.5 hours.

This City is Whadjuk Country

This self-guided tour explores Whadjuk Nyoongar history, providing insight into how Nyoongar people lived prior to white settlement in 1829.

Fighting for Families: Country, Rights and Recognition

This tour focuses on Aboriginal history in Perth after 1829, including significant events such as the resistance of Whadjuk leaders Midgegooroo and his son Yagan in the 1830s, the Prohibited Area Zone from 1927 to 1954, and the Aboriginal protest rallies of the 1930s and 1940s.

Cultural tours

Go Cultural - Goomup Walking Tour 2.0

Experience the world's oldest living culture through ancient Dreamtime stories, traditional songs, and Nyoongar language on this enlightening cultural walking tour. Discover how the natural world and elemental forces have shaped the daily lives of the Nyoongar people, fostering their unique spiritual connection to this boodjah (earth or country).

Djurandi Dreaming – Finding Yagan

Learn about the Nyoongar resistance warrior and leader, Yagan. Starting at the yongas (kangaroos) at Supreme Court Gardens, and travelling through iconic laneways as you're immersed in traditional Dreaming stories.

Hear traditional stories of Whadjuk Country and the history of the Nyoongar people as you explore the Banksia Garden and learn about medicinal plants and bush foods.

Have you ever wondered who gets to choose the exhibitions at the Museum and if the staff get to play hide and seek after hours? Well, we sent in an investigative team of kids to ask these questions and more to WA Museum Director of Engagement, Jason Fair.

Jason has worked at the WA Museum for 18 years. He started out managing all the things you can buy at the Museum, such as toys in the shop and food at the café. He quickly became really interested in the people who visited the Museum, and wanted to better understand why people came to visit and what they wanted to see. This led him to his current job.

Here are the questions our little investigators put to him.

Kimberley VR

Immerse yourself in a breathtaking virtual reality journey by White Spark Pictures, showcasing the dramatic landscapes of the Kimberley region. It's set to be an unforgettable adventure!

What is your favourite part of working at the museum?

I love the diversity of my job. One minute I could be meeting with the Italian Consulate General, or the Ambassador from Peru, and the next I am supervising the installation of a new exhibition about the Moon.

How did you get to have your job?

Believe it or not, I worked for a big toy store company before coming to work at the WA Museum. I got my current job because of all the work I did to learn about and value our visitors and what they liked to see when they came to the Museum.

Do you get to play with the exhibits before everyone else?

I sure do! This is how I check to make sure all our visitors can come and have a great time interacting with our exhibitions.

Do you get to play hide and seek in the museum?

Unfortunately, no, but when the new museum was first opened, I got lost A LOT and had to find my way out! That was a bit like playing hide-and-seek.

Can you tell us a secret about the museum that most people don't know?

I have an office that is in an old safe!

How do you come up with ideas for new exhibitions?

We plan our exhibitions years in advance and I have a team of amazing staff who help choose and design exhibitions for our visitors to enjoy.

For example, our exhibition To the Moon came from wanting to share with our visitors the current work in Space development happening in Perth, and our connection with space. So, we started by borrowing a piece of moon rock from NASA and displaying Luke Jerram's seven metre moon replica.

With these two items and a team of great people, we were able to build an interactive and fun exhibition.

If you could bring one exhibit to life, which one would it be?

That is easy, the Night Parrot, a specimen on display in the Wild Life gallery, which is so rare it was once thought extinct. It came to the Museum after dying due to injuries when it was caught by its wing on a fence, which was very sad.

The Night Parrot is really hard to find—not only is it nocturnal (only coming out at night) but it lives in some of the harshest parts of Australia.

So, if I could bring it back to life and set it free where it came from, I would!

However, specimens like the Night Parrot help our scientists and researchers learn more about this mysterious bird, which will help us protect them in the future.

What is your favourite thing in the museum?

Ross Potter's hand drawn young humpback whale drawn at life-size and hanging outside the Wild Life gallery at Boola Bardip.

It is my favourite because it was drawn by hand using a pencil and it is life-size! Ross created the drawing while doing some workshops at the WA Maritime Museum in Fremantle and donated it to the WA Museum's collection. I saw Ross when he was working on it and he told me that he was inspired by a 45-minute encounter with a humpback whale off Hillarys.

How can I work in a museum when I grow up?

There are so many different opportunities at the Museum.

One of the things I like about the Museum is the variety of jobs people do and how they all work together to make the Museum a great place to visit. You could work as a scientist, a curator who researches the objects in our collection, a visitor services officer, a retail assistant in one of our shops, build the digital parts of our exhibitions or teach children who visit our museums.

There are so many ways to be part of the Museum, you can even volunteer once you turn 16!



Jason was a good sport, answering our young investigators' questions. He also shared with us some of the super exciting things coming up across summer at WA Museum Boola Bardip.

Check out the biggest and best VR experience The Great Kimberley Wilderness where you will be able to get up close and personal with some of the most untouched areas of the Kimberley region.

If virtual reality isn't quite your thing, you can take a self-guided 'Codebreakers' tour.

Part scavenger hunt, part escape room, this is a different way to explore Boola Bardip and possibly the closest you will get to hide-and-seek!

For those not quite old enough to be breaking codes, the Little Learners' program is educator-led and designed especially for ages 2 – 5.

Or check out the drop-and-leave school holiday programs which allow kids to get the best out of the Museum while adults take a break. Get in quick as these tend to book out fast!

In the heart of Perth, the journey to sustainability thrives at Perth City Farm, where Kathleen, a long-time advocate for eco-friendly living, has made her mark. Delve into her inspiring story—from her humble beginnings as a volunteer to becoming the CEO of the beloved community hub. Discover how Kathleen's early encounters with nature shaped her passion for sustainability and learn about the exciting programs designed for families and kids.

What's your adventure story to becoming the CEO of Perth City Farm? What sparked your interest in this awesome role?

I first came to Perth City Farm to volunteer in 2009. I had recently graduated from uni and was a bit bored and lonely so a friend told me to come and have coffee at the Saturday Farmers Market. I wasn't very interested in sustainability or organic produce but I loved the gardens and the quirky passionate people—I found a welcoming community. I set the intention to work here one day and in 2017 I was offered the CEO role.

Can you tell us about your first encounter with sustainability? Was it a magical moment that inspired an exciting career path?

My Mum has always cared about sustainability so we did lots of nature care activities growing up like visiting the Herdsman Wetlands Centre and growing trees at school for Trillion Trees. But coming to Perth City Farm was the first time I chose to get involved with a sustainability project as an adult and it was really magical actually, I felt there was a good spirit in the trees here. I'd just finished studying accounting so I wasn't really open to spiritual moments, but I found some magic here!

What's your top tip for people who want to sprinkle a little more sustainability into their daily lives?

Take small and steady steps to shift your family's habits and celebrate the changes you make so it's a really positive experience. Pick one habit like buying toilet rolls wrapped in paper instead of plastic, then make use of the pretty paper wraps and cardboard rolls to make personalised festive crackers. Then move on to another habit to shift!

How do you think the cool stuff you and your team do at Perth City Farm helps our community today and for kids in the future?

All of our work is about harnessing the power of nature and community connection, bringing people together to learn about sustainable living. We do that through programs for kids and adults, teaching things like food growing, nature crafts, preserving food and using less power. People think that 'the environment' is the key beneficiary of people living more sustainably, but it actually makes your life much better! Doing these things helps you connect with other people, save money, eat more healthily, be more mindful and prioritise the things in life that make us happy. Connecting to nature helps people learn, make friends, improve selfesteem, be active outdoors and feel positive about the world in the context of a changing climate.

Perth City Farm sounds like a playground for families! What fun programs do you have for kids and families to learn about sustainability? Any exciting summer holiday workshops we should know about?

Perth City Farm is open Monday to Saturday and is free for the community to explore whenever the gates are open. We also have a Nature Playgroup on Saturdays during the school term which is a guided experience for families with young children. Each month there is Grandma Rosie's Storytime, an intergenerational session with stories, singing and exploring the farm. And lots of schools or social groups visit us for tours and activity days if you want to organise a group to come.

Got any tips for parents on how to introduce their little ones to the world of farming and being eco-friendly at home?

Kitchen gardening is a great place to start, growing new food from scraps like carrot tops, growing salad sprouts like alfalfa or visiting a local farmers market and creating challenges to use unusual seasonal fruit and veg is great. Food is a great place to start with being eco-friendly because we all eat every day and it's a huge area of waste so lots of potential to have an impact.

Can you share a meaningful story or a fun success from Perth City Farm that shows your impact on the community?

Our Grandma Rosie Storytime is a beautiful monthly event run by volunteers, headed up by our Founder Rosanne Scott who started Perth City Farm thirty years ago. The story time sessions are run by a collective of grandparents who choose books, songs and craft activities to match a nature-based theme and share them with other parents/grandparents and their youngsters.

What makes you passionate about sustainability and the environment? Do you have a fun story that shows just how much you love our planet?

I think if you care about yourself, and the people you love, you have to be passionate about sustainability and the environment—we are nature and the natural world is keeping us alive and making life worth living. I've done a couple of 4-day solo nature quests where you sit in the bush and connect with nature. It's pretty extreme and there are some very funny moments (like getting ticks in places you don't want them!) but the feeling of connection and stillness that comes from it is incredible.

Sustainable fun this summer!

Sustainability is something that can be fun for the family, and the planet. And the good news is that the City has plenty of ways for you to go green while enjoying a range of amazing experiences. Here are some simple and exciting ideas for your family to reduce its environmental footprint while making the most of your City experience.





Get behind our sustainable businesses

Let's support the local businesses that support our environment! Swing by Made in the City of at 69 Barrack St, where you can check out how they turn plastic lids into one-of-a-kind gifts. This amazing business has also developed a program to help mature-age women get back into the workforce. Visit their workshop and retail store from Thursdays to Saturdays after 12pm, including late-night shopping on Fridays.

If fashion is more your style, explore awesome vintage stores like FA Concept Vintage, Fi & Co, Dada Records and Retro 66. You can also check out local markets like the Black Friday RAG Fashion Pop-up at Perth Town Hall on 29 November, Perth Upmarket, and the Christmas Twilight Perth Makers Market at Supreme Court Gardens, also on 29 November. Don't forget to grab fresh, locally grown goodies at the Perth City Farm Farmers Market, happening every Saturday morning from November to February.

Native bees are busy bees

There's a lot of buzz around our native bees and how important they are to our environment. Western Australia is home to around 800 different types of bees, and these little legends play a big role in helping our plants prosper through spreading their vital pollen. But they need our help, too! Here's how you can be a bee hero:

Native bees love native flowers

- Mortadella, mild salami and free-range leg ham
- · Provolone cheese, sliced
- · Iceberg lettuce, thinly sliced
- · White onion, thinly sliced

- 1. Soak the chickpeas overnight in plenty of water.
- 2. Preheat your oven to 180°C.
- 3. Cut the carrots into half-moon shapes.
- 4. In a bowl, toss the carrots and soaked chickpeas with olive oil, salt, and pepper. Spread them on a baking sheet and roast in the preheated oven until golden and tender, about 20-25 minutes.
- In a large pot, bring salted water to a simmer.
 Add the couscous and cook until just tender, about 10 minutes. Drain and set aside.
- 6. Whisk together yoghurt, tahini, lemon juice, paprika, olive oil, salt, and pepper to taste until smooth.
- Combine the couscous, baby spinach or mixed leaves, pickled onions, chopped parsley, and dill.
- 8. Drizzle with the dressing and toss gently to coat then serve topping each with the roasted chickpeas, carrots, and crumbled feta cheese.

Here are some of their highlights.

Emma:

We started off with a Ferry Ride—so fun! The beautiful views of Swan River and city skyline, cruising into Elizabeth Quay from Mends St, South Perth were amazing.

We found this to be super accessible, so easy to use the ramp to get on and off ferry. There was plenty of space for wheelchair users. And it was easy to tag on and off with a SmartRider.

We walked/wheeled around Elizabeth Quay area for a bit, before heading over to the Elizabeth Quay Bus Station, just a quick walk/roll away.

From there we caught the free Blue CAT to Kings Park. Lucy found it helpful that the CAT bus stop had a motion activated speaker to advise when the next cat bus service would be, and the bus lowers itself right down to deploy a ramp for wheelchair users. The bus ride was a speedy 5 mins to Kings Park.

Lucy:

The Blue CAT stopped right behind the cafes at Kings Park. We got to see the awesome city and river views while we ate our morning tea (and I had an icecream).

Nic:

We then ventured towards the glass bridge passing through the Lotterywest Federation Walkway. Lucy was amazed to be rolling among the treetops! She was also very interested in the Conservation Garden on the way, learning a lot about rare and endangered plant species. I loved seeing an accessible toilet along the way too.

We then hopped back on the Blue CAT back to the Elizabeth Quay Bus Station and caught the Green CAT to City West Station to make our way to Scitech. This was another quick five minute bus journey.

Lucy:

Scitech—Wow what a place! Everyone was so nice. Most of the activities were wheelchair accessible. My favourite activities included the Planetarium (the staff gave us a special spot to sit at the side as we couldn't get up the stair but we could still everything perfectly) and the 'Blow Your Mind' activity, which was under cool UV lights. Oh, and that huge plasma ball is really cool! We also saw a fun and interesting show about the elements—the professor was so funny, and silly, and performed some really cool (and loud) experiments.

Emma:

Oh a trick here—the staff advised us not to wait in the line for the shows or Planetarium and instead go straight to the entrance so Lucy could get to her wheelchair bay easily without weaving through the crowd!

Nic:

From Scitech we made our way to City West Train Station to catch the train into Perth Train Station, it was then just two minutes to The Globe for lunch. The Globe is directly off Wellington St, so close and convenient to get to from Perth Train Station. We ordered food and drinks straight from the table via a QR code and the staff brought it over to us, so there was no going back and forth. Scrumptious food, just what we needed for the big day, and overall, an easy access and stress-free experience.

Lucy:

After lunch we went to B.Lucky & Sons, which was about a 3-minute roll away—it was action packed! First up, we went ten pin bowling—super easy with ramp access and bowling aids, and the staff there were really friendly. We were getting peckish again so we ordered snacks and drinks straight from the table where we were bowling from via a QR code and the staff brought it over to us.

Emma:

After bowling, we tried our luck with the arcade games. Lucy managed to score a Miffy bunny from a claw machine—that never happens.

Lucv:

I really loved the Air Hockey game, the Ball Drop game, and of course, the Claw Machine.

Nic:

A lot of the arcade games were accessible, and thethe buzz and accessibility of the venue made for a lot of fun.

From B.Lucky & Sons, it was only 8 minutes to WA Museum Boola Bardip which was totally accessible and a really a calming experience to end our busy day out. There were so many interactive activities to see and do.

Lucy:

There was an amazing whale skeleton that hung above out heads and also lots of information about minibeasts and megafauna that used to live here in WA.

I also had lots of fun riding through the water mist jets outside the museum!





Did you know?

The City of Perth offers a variety of accessibility-friendly facilities. You'll find kerb ramps, tactile indicators, and audible signals at crossings to assist those with mobility challenges. Wheelchairs and motorized scooters are available for hire at the Citiplace Community Centre.

Accessible public toilets are conveniently located throughout the city, including at the Citiplace Rest Centre, State Library, Art Gallery, bus stations, Allendale Square, and Barrack Square. Plus, all city transport options—including trains and the free CAT buses—are fully accessible, as are the ferries from Barrack Street Jetty to South Perth, perfect for a trip to the zoo!

Scitech

Offers free admission for carers and has wheelchair access lifts throughout. The multisensory exhibits feature tactile and sensory elements, ensuring an engaging experience for all visitors. For those seeking a quieter environment, visiting during the afternoons on non-school holidays is highly recommended.

WA Museum Boola Bardip

Provides visual supports and checklists developed in collaboration with the Autism Association of WA, helping children know what to expect during their visit. The sensory maps identify quieter areas, making it easier to navigate the space comfortably. Sensory backpacks are also available, equipped with tools to calm and engage sensory systems. Additionally, Auslan interpreters can be requested for talks.

Kings Park

Ensures accessibility for people with disabilities, their families, and carers. The Visitor Information Centre offers free wheelchair use and there is a network of hard paths and ramps to key areas.

Playgrounds at Kings Park are universal access, with ramps and accessible pathways, and there are play areas designed for children with developmental delays or learning difficulties, offering tranquil and sensory experiences.

B.Lucky & Sons

Offers free arcade access for carers and provide all-day discounted game cards for individuals with disabilities, making fun more accessible. They also cater to sensory needs by allowing music and lights to be adjusted for a calmer experience. Plus, with sensory maps available, planning your visit is easier than ever.

The Globe on Wellington Street

Has wheelchair accessibility, to ensures that everyone can enjoy their time there. Ordering food and drinks is a breeze with their easy-to-use QR code system, featuring a visual menu to help you make delicious choices. Plus, the dog-friendly beer garden allows you to bring your furry friends along for a great day out.






Make your own origami swan using this easy pattern:




Fold square paper in half along one diagonal and then unfold.



Now fold the lower edges of the paper into the centreline.




Flip the paper over.




Make a double fold as shown. Repeat the other side




Fold the point of the piece up.
