
Day 1 – Saturday – January 10th

- Curitiba is the Capital of Parana State, located in the South East region of Brazil. Its 1,8 million inhabitants have 16 parks, 14 forests and more than 1000 green public spaces as their immediate neighbours. As a whole, the green urban areas in Curitiba are among the largest in the world and every seemed inhabitant of the city has approximately 52 m² of nature to romp about in. Brazil's green capital makes a tremendous effort to preserve the city's natural environment and is regarded by many as one of the world's best examples of green urban planning.

Paraná State Cooperatives System which represents more than 230 affiliated cooperatives and congregates more than five hundred thousand members. It is made up of farmers, credit, educational, infrastructure, labor, transport, leisure and tourism, mineral, transport, housing and health cooperatives. The system represents more than 50% of the state rural GDP.

- Large grain operation with a total of 1.540 ha, (3.850 acres). Corn area 650ha (1.625 acres), soy 650 ha (1.650 acres), drybean 240 ha (600 acres), wheat 650 ha (1.625 acres), black oat as cover crop 890 ha (2.225 acres) and pastures 25ha (62 acres). Beef cattle herd of 180 heads of Aberdeen Angus, only bulls and breeds. Storage facilities on the farm.

Mechanization, Plant Pathology, Forage Crops, Agrometeorological Monitoring System, Soil Fertility, Crop Protection, Weeds, Enthomology, Crop Science

Dutch origin Cooperative founded in 1951. Today around 1300 members and example of cooperativism and high agricultural yields. Agriculture – 100% notill and # 1 in Brazil in Milk production. Also updated pig farmers. Annual income U\$ 1,2 billion







Farm visit (grains)

Dutch origin family. Large operation in four different farms with a total of 760 ha of grains (Summer, soy, corn and drybean, Winter, wheat, ryegrass and oats). Average – corn – 11.500kg/ha, soy – 3.800kg/ha. Mushroom production in one of the farms mainly for compost production. Pig farming – farrow-to-finish with 850 sows with an average of 25 piglets/sow/year, and a biodigestor to supply the power needs of the operation. 100 employees altogether.

Visit Dutch Immigration Memorial

Windmill as high as a 10-story building that was built to celebrate the Castrolanda Colony and Cooperative Golden Jubilee in 2001

Farm Visit (dairy)

Dutch origin family. Around 500 he (1200 acres) of agriculture. Dairy with a double 16 milk parlour, TMR and corn silage, brewery barley residue, wet corn, soy meal, hay silage and minerals, heard of 1900 heads, 980 in lactation, average production of 10.299 kg milk/lactation, 3.45% fat, 3.15% protein.

Day 6 – Thursday – January 15th

Drive to Entre Rios Visit Agrária Cooperative

Agrária Cooperative is a German origin cooperative. It has approximately 500 members, farming about 260,000 acres, with an annual production of \$900 million. They produce corn, soybeans, wheat, oats, and barley. They are the largest malt supplier for Brazilian breweries, they have a wheat milling plant, and they have a large soybean crushing plant and a brandnew Malt Processing Plant.

The Agrária Cooperative was founded by German-speakers who previously lived in the former Kingdom of Hungary and who immigrated to Brazil after WWII. In 2011, to celebrate the cooperatives Golden Jubilee, the Suabian Museum was opened to tell their story. You will have an opportunity to visit the museum.

You will also visit the Agrária Foundation of Agricultural Research. FAPA was founded in 1994 to systematize rural research. Today, because of the quality of its many researchers that work for the institution, FAPA provides reference information that is used on both a state and national basis. The Research Plots cover 550 acres for research on corn, wheat, barley and oats. (if available)

Happy Hour and dinner will be at a local Brewery operated by a German couple. Donau Bier Brewery was started in 2004; the homemade beer produced there follows the *Reinheitsgebot* German Quality Law for making beer which dates from 1516: it states that a beer is pure only when the ingredients are water, malt and hop. Following the brewery visit you will enjoy beer tasting and typical German food.

 Visit Dry Port CODAPAR

The CODAPAR Cascavel Dry Port is a public customs terminal located in the city of Cascavel, which has been managed by CODAPAR - Paraná Agricultural Development Company, a company linked to the Paraná State Department of Agriculture and Supply (SEAB), as a Federal Revenue Licensee, since November 1999. Given its strategic location this terminal is an extremely important instrument for customs clearance of products imported and/or exported from Brazil, Argentina, Paraguay and Chile. It also enables imports and exports of industries and agro-industries in the region, via the Port of Paranaguá and Afonso Pena International Airport.

- Day 8 Saturday January 17th
- Visit Iguaçu National Park

Brazil's first national park and today one of the most visited places sights in the country. The visitor's center is the opening gate to an unforgettable adventure in a preserved area ending at the falls, which are four times the width of Niagara and formed by 275 interlinked cataracts up to 75 m (246 feet) over a 3km (1,8 mile) wide precipice. Today elected as one of the world's seven modern wonders.

Macuco Safari Ride

A trail in the woods on a carriage pulled by an electric powered vehicle and a walk followed by a boat ride by the Iguaçú River all the way to the Falls.

After a fascinating tour, there is nothing like enjoying the best regional and international cuisine in a sophisticated atmosphere and comfort.

The Porto Canoas Restaurant features a buffet service with a variety of salads, hot dishes, desserts and best drinks, not to mention the unique view from the top of the Iguassu Falls.





Visit Itaipu Dam

It is the largest in the world and a binational joint venture on the Parana River, between Brazil and Paraguay. The installed capacity of the power plant was 12,000,000 kilowatts (kW). Nowadays it contains 20 generators with a 700,000 kW capacity each. Its installed capacity is 14,000,000 kW. The power plant is responsible for 90% of the energy consumed in Paraguay and 22% of that consumed in Brazil

Dinner Show

This is a beautiful restaurant with an inviting and varied menu of salads, hot and cold items, meats and desserts. The big attraction in the restaurant is the multicultural show that demonstrates the culture of many Latin America cities through music and folkloric dances with rhythms that go from samba to tango. Paraguay, Chile, Bolivia, Peru and Brazil are some of the nationalities represented in this dinner-show. The dancers beautiful performances represent their nations cultures faithfully. The dinner will be delicious and the show fascinating!



- Day 10 Monday January 19th
- Visit the Rosario Board of Trade
- The Rosario Board of Trade is a non-profit making association based in Rosario, in the Province of Santa Fé, Argentina. Founded on August 18, 1884, it serves as a forum for the conduct of trade negotiations in several markets including grain, oilseed, agricultural products and their by-products, as well as securities and other assets.
- Farm Visit (grains)
 In the afternoon visit to an agricultural farm located in the heart of the main productive region of the country to meet the farmer, talk and learn about his production.

Day 11 – Tuesday – January 20th

Visit to a big and modern grain terminal for exportation of ACA.

The region around Rosario contains the world's largest concentrations oil seed crushing plant; andits ports handle more than 50% of the Argentine export of soybean and its derivatives.

Drive to Las Pareja to visit a company that produces agricultural implements

Las Parejas, a city in the Santa Fe province of Argentina, is a nerve center for the manufacturing of agricultural machinery and implements. This productive hub stands out for its dynamism, innovation, and the high concentration of companies dedicated to this vital sector for the Argentine economy.

Day 12 – Wednesday – January 21st

Visit Farmer's Cooperative

Agricultural cooperatives have been a historically crucial pillar in Argentina's agricultural development. Their key role allowed small and medium-sized farmers to access markets, supplies, and technology, reducing risks and strengthening their bargaining power. Beyond adding value by processing produce at the source, they boosted economic and social development in rural areas, keeping families on their land and fostering innovation. This collaborative model not only democratized the agrarian economy but also positioned Argentina as a major player in global food production and export.

Drive to Buenos Aires with a winery stop on the way

Bodega Gamboa is one of the few vineyards located outside the main wine-growing regions, for a tasting and early soft dinner. 
Day 13 – Thursday – January 22nd

Early morning visit to Mercado Agroganadero de Cañuelas

The Mercado Agroganadero de Cañuelas (MAG) is Argentina's main and most modern cattle trading center. It's located in Cañuelas, Buenos Aires Province. It opened in May 2022, replacing the historic Liniers Market, which had operated for over 120 years in Buenos Aires City.

- Buenos Aires is the capital of Argentina and is where most cultural, political and economic activities take place. It is a charming city with a strong influence from the most important cities of Europe. Beautiful walks, avenues and parks, monumental buildings, typical restaurant, pavement cafes, churches and museums in 46 different regions – each with its own personality. The north offers an elegant resemblance of Paris, with the May Avenue housing the most unforgettable coffee houses.
